Information Guide

Summary and Competition Overview:

For the first time ever, the UK will see a fair universities competition to determine the top universities in the country. Each university will compete against all others in cheer, dance, and group stunt. Universities will receive a score for placing in each of these divisions, the highest score from all divisions will be totalled and a top university will be crowned.

Currently in the UK, most university cheerleaders first discover cheerleading when they arrive at university. Cheerleading in the UK is expanding and developing so fast, over the next few years we will start to see more and more experienced cheerleaders turning up at universities to carry on the sport. Currently the sport isn't big enough, especially within the university world for a single university to have developed a reputation for cheerleading prowess. It is expected that over time, cheer athletes will start factoring in the continuation of cheerleading as part of their university choice, in much the same way as in the states.

This competition will hopefully start to develop university cheerleading further, raise the standard, push co-ed, determine the strongest universities for cheerleading and most importantly get it recognised with your athletic unions as being a sport and not a society.

2012 Updates

- We have gotten rid of BUCS scoring guideline [New guideline is easier to understand]
- You can now have 2 dance teams, 2 All-girl or 2 coed teams (If you would like enter a 3rd , 4th all-girl or coed team you can, {we will only use the highest to determine the Grand Champion})
- Depending on registration we may split the divisions in small, medium, and large.
- Each division will receive a trophy for each entry (i.e 1st, 2nd , 3rd) 1st place will receive a banner

Common Questions and Answers:

My team is only level 1, how can we compete in a level 6 competition?

There are very few universities that are level 3 or above so virtually everyone competing is in the same position as you. It is a university competition, not a level 6 competition however it is open at this level because it's fair for everyone, doesn't restrict teams, or individuals skills, everyone is over 18 and therefore, according to the rules should be competing at level 6.

Do we have to do level 6 skills?

No, perform your routine as normal, if you have higher level skills that you don't normally do at your current level you may include them, i.e. if you have tumblers who can twist competently, they are free to do this if you wish.

Will there be a CO-ED division?

Yes, if you have an all girl team and a co-ed team

COMPETITORS CAN NOT COMPETE ON BOTH ALL-GIRL & CO-ED CHEER TEAM

We don't want to compete because we have no chance for Grand Champion!?

Remember there are probably only 4 universities you could name that you would expect to see placing in cheer. Any university could win group stunt? Every university has an abundance of good dancers to win the dance division. The standard of university teams change dramatically year to year depending on who they gain and lose so you can't really base your opinion on last season. Some university teams that are considered 'good' include a number of people not eligible to compete at this competition. The competition is open for any university to win!

You can still enter this event if your program only has one team and a group stunt.

Trophies will be given out for each division

I don't understand the scoring system, can you explain again?

The university with the highest average from all 5 categories is grand champion.

We will only use the highest score from each category:

- Cheer All-Girl***
- Cheer Co-Ed***
- Dance Team***
- Group Stunt no males***
- Co-Ed Group Stunt***

****Enter two dance / cheer (same division) teams, we will only use the higher score for University Grand Champions.***

Our entry only gives us a max of 42 competitors, how can we field 36 in cheer, 36 in dance, and 5 in group stunt, that's 77 people?

Buy extra tickets, compete with less people, USE crossovers. 42 are based on 36 in a cheer team, 5 extra people doing dance and not cheer and 1 coach. COMPETITORS CAN NOT COMPETE ON BOTH ALL-GIRL & CO-ED CHEER TEAM

JAZZ

A jazz routine incorporates stylized dance movements and combinations, formation changes, group work, leaps and turns. Emphasis is placed on proper technical execution, extension, control, body placement and team uniformity.

POM

Pom poms must be used 80% of the routine. Important characteristics of a pom routine include synchronization and visual effect, clean and precise motions, strong pom technique, and incorporate dance technical elements. Visual effect includes level changes, group work, formation changes, the use of different color poms, etc.

HIP HOP

Routines emphasize the street style movements with an emphasis on execution, style, creativity, body isolations and control, rhythm, uniformity and musical interpretation. Teams may also put an additional focus on athletic incorporations such as jumps, jump variations, combo jumps and other tricks.

TEAM ARTICLES OF UNDERSTANDING

- II. Before filling out registration forms please read and understand rules and guidelines to ensure that you are registering your team or stunt group in the correct division and level. It is not the fault of WCC for teams that are placed in the wrong division or level by any coach or sponsor. In the event that a team is placed in the wrong division or level, WCC will make every attempt to place that team in the correct division before or at the event. If it is found to be impossible to move the team that team will be disqualified. In the event of a disqualification no refunds will be given.
- III. The age that participants are as of Aug 31st, 2011 will be the age group that team will enter. A coach or sponsor must have proof of age
- IV. The oldest participant on any team determines the age group that team will enter.
- V. All team members must begin with both feet on the performance surface, inside the performance area.
- VI. Timing of the routine will begin with the first note of music, first words of cheer, first organized motion or building of stunt or pyramid.
- VII. Total time of routine can be no longer than 2:30 for cheer teams, 2:30 for dance teams, 1:15 for solos and 1:15 for group and partner stunts. This time includes any cheers or chants performed with or without music. Teams exceeding time limit will incur penalties to overall score or up to disqualification.
- VIII. A coach or sponsor must be responsible for handling team music during the competition. This coach or sponsor will be responsible for running music during the performance. This coach or sponsor must remain at the sound table during the entire performance.
- IX. Music may be on Ipod, MP3, Media Player, or CD. Coach or sponsor must provide a back up IPOD in the event a CD will not play. Some CD players will not play certain custom burned CDs. **We highly suggest using a portable media player.**
- X. Cheer teams may use poms, flags, megaphones and signs. No other props will be permitted.
- XI. Participants may cross compete where applicable. Cross competition is limited only by age requirements.
- XII. Group stunt and partner stunt routines are limited to 1 minute and 15 seconds. All music. Dance, motions, tumbling or jumps will not be scored and may negatively affect your score.
- XIII. Partner stunt and stunt group competitors must provide a spotter that is familiar with the routine.
- XIV. All members of a University team must be enrolled in the University that the cheer team represents.
- XV. No team or stunt group is guaranteed another team to compete against. In the event of a one team division possible combinations will be reviewed and made at the discretion of WCC officials.
- XVI. In the event that a routine is interrupted due to the fault of WCC event staff, the facility or its staff, or equipment failure, the coach of that team will be given the option of continuing from the point of interruption, starting over or withdraw from the competition.
- XVII. In the event the routine is interrupted due to a failure of the teams equipment (tape, CD, etc) or an injury the coach will be given the option of continuing from the point of interruption or withdraw from the competition.
- XVIII. WCC event staff reserves the right to stop a performance due to injury.
- XIX. WCC is not responsible for events in your travel plans that might affect your arrival at the competition or a team performance. WCC will make every effort to accommodate your team in the event an issue arises.
